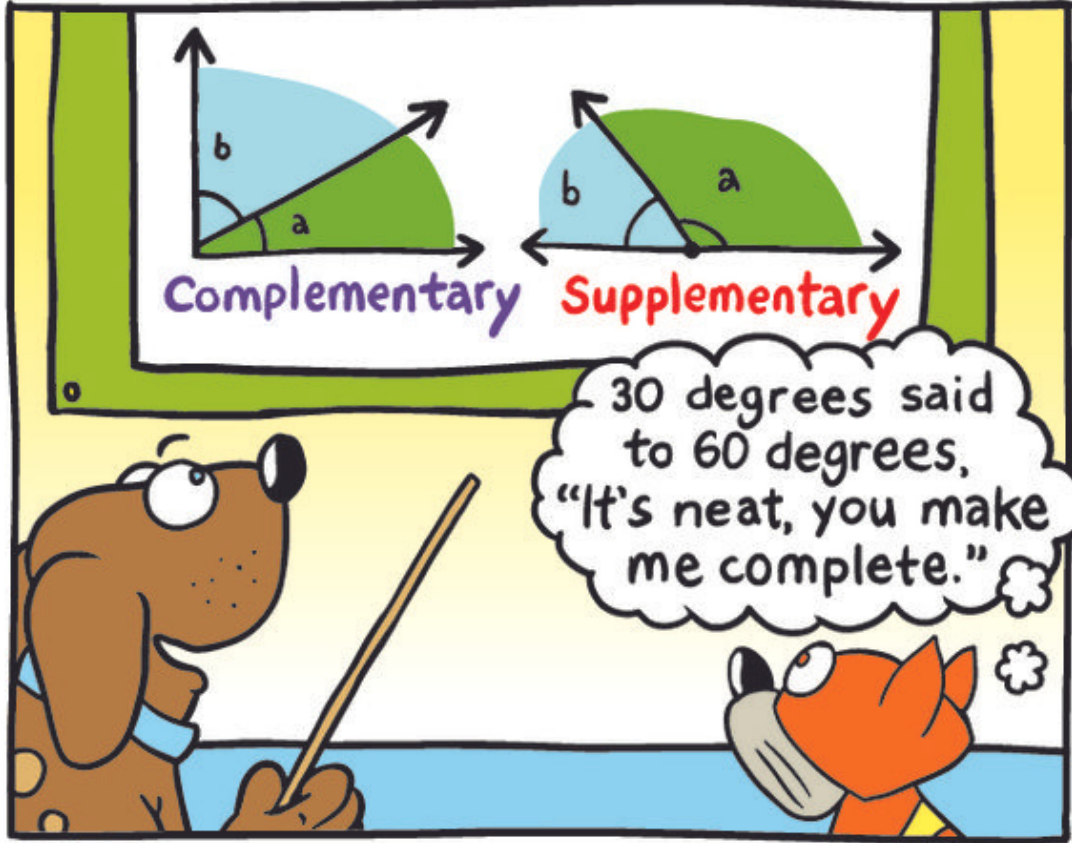

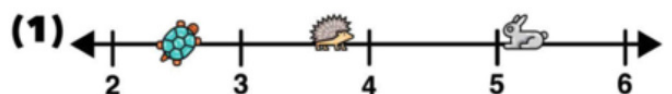

SAC Preparation

Year 12 Maths Methods students will be sitting their first school assessed coursework sometime this term. The type of questions that students will encounter are different to the text book questions. Therefore to achieve higher marks, their preparation needs to be different.

The questions generally incorporate knowledge from different areas of maths including those that haven't necessarily been taught recently but have been encountered before. Therefore it's necessary to review concepts from the past two or three years.

The questions generally are several parts long, requiring the student's ability to see the link between each part. Sometimes even if an answer is incorrect or unable to be worked out, the resilience to proceed with the rest of the question is required.

The best way to prepare for this form of assessment is to do similar types of questions. The extended response questions from the chapter review are a start. It's important to attempt the preparation material provided by the school. Various commercially available practice material such as ATAR notes, Checkpoints and extended response questions from the VCAA exams also make good preparation material.
