

Which of the three statements below is a lie? Explain how you made your choice.




























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Post Exam Analysis by Selvi Wensor

 Going over a completed and marked exam with your tutor will help you see where your strengths and weakness lie. Maths topics are often built on previous knowledge. As such, learning about your performance in a mid-year exam will help you better prepare for the end of the year exam.

- Generally, exams have multiple choice, short and extended response sections where often the multiple choice and extended response parts can be attempted with the aid of a calculator. Notes may also be allowed for certain parts of an exam.
- By going over an exam with a tutor, you will learn where you have done well, what areas need improvement and what type of errors have been made in a personal manner. Some of the points you can discuss with your tutor are how marks are allocated, how to save time by using technology and what order to tackle the exam questions.
- In addition, your tutor may provide questions to improve on areas of weakness based on your performance on the exam. This reflection and learning from your performance is a very important part of learning process.
